

Patient lacks parathyroid hormone and is at risk of hypocalcemia

Calcium crisis can be life-threatening

I have HypoPARAthyroidism, a rare endocrine disorder I may require emergency treatment.

- Immediate calcium blood test
 - Patient may be experiencing tetany, seizures, laryngospasm, cramping, nausea, tingling; check calcium (ionized and serum), albumin, kidney function, and EKG
- If hypocalcemic, administer calcium gluconate I.V.
- Contact physician for more clinical information (see reverse)
- Frequent monitoring of calcium until stable
